# How to avoid OSHA's top 10 workplace injuries.



The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) released a list of 2024's top safety violations on the jobsite. By understanding these risks and putting simple prevention strategies in place, employers can help create a safer work environment and avoid costly claims. ## 1. Fall protection

Safety tip: Make a fall plan and review it regularly. Get the proper scaffolding, ladders, harnesses, personal protection equipment (PPE), and safety gear for the team. Then, follow these other <u>fall</u> prevention tips.

## 2. Hazard communication

Safety tip: Ensure all chemicals are clearly labeled and employees are trained to read safety data sheets (SDS).

## 3. Control of hazardous energy (lockout/tagout)

Safety tip: Use <u>lockout/tagout procedures</u> to protect your crew from the release of hazardous energy from energy sources, like electrical, mechanical, hydraulic, pneumatic, chemical, thermal, and other sources in machines and equipment.

## 4. Ladders

Safety tip: Inspect ladders for damage before use and never exceed the maximum load rating. Use ladders in their proper fashion.

# 5. Respiratory protection

Safety tip: Provide the right respirators for the job and make sure they fit and are worn correctly.

Replace old or worn respiratory protection.

#### 6. Powered industrial trucks

Safety tip: Only allow trained/credentialed operators to use forklifts. Inspect equipment daily before operation.

# 7. Fall protection training

Safety tip: Provide hands-on fall protection safety training and annual refresher courses for all team members. Follow <u>OSHA's fall prevention training guidelines</u>.

## 8. Scaffolding

Safety tip: Make sure scaffolds are fully planked, properly secured, and inspected before each shift.

# 9. Eye and face protection

Safety tip: Require and enforce the use of protective eyewear and masking in all high-risk areas, especially where debris or chemicals are present.

# 10. Machine guarding

Safety tip: Don't bypass or remove machine guards. Keep them in place and routinely check for wear and damage.
